(b) All delivery orders or task orders are subject to the terms and conditions of this contract. In the event of conflict between a delivery order or task order and this contract, the contract shall control.

(c) If mailed, a delivery order or task order is considered "issued" when the Government deposits the order in the mail. Orders may be issued orally, by facsimile, or by electronic commerce methods only if authorized in the Schedule.

52.216-19 ORDER LIMITATIONS. (OCT 1995)

(a) Minimum order. When the Government requires supplies or services covered by this contract in an amount of less than \$500.00, the Government is not obligated to purchase, nor is the Contractor obligated to furnish, those supplies or services under the contract.

(b) Maximum order. The Contractor is not obligated to honor:

(1) Any order for a single item in excess of \$200,000.00;

(2) Any order for a combination of items in excess of \$500,000.00; or

(f) Any order issued during the effective period of this contract and not completed within that period shall be completed by the Contractor within the time specified in the order. The contract shall govern the Contractor's and Government's rights and obligations with respect to that order to the same extent as if the order were completed during the contract's effective period; provided, that the Contractor shall not be required to make any deliveries under this contract after 30 Sep 04.

52.217-8 OPTION TO EXTEND SERVICES (NOV 1999)

The Government may require continued performance of any services within the limits and at the rates specified in contract. These rates may be adjusted only as a result of revisions to prevailing labor rates provided by the Secretary of Labor. The option provision may be exercised more than once, but the total extension of performance hereunder shall not exceed 6 months. The Contracting Officer may exercise the option by written notice to the Contractor within 30 days.

Contractor personnel are required to wear or prominently display installation identification badges or contractor-furnished, contractor identification badges while visiting or performing work on the installation.

(b) The contractor shall submit a written request on company letterhead to the contracting officer listing the following: contract number, location of work site, start and stop dates, and names of employees and subcontractor employees needing access to the base. The letter will also specify the individual(s) authorized to sign for a request for base identification credentials or vehicle passes. The contracting officer will endorse the request and forward it to the issuing base pass and registration office or security police for processing. When reporting to the registration office, the authorized contractor individual(s) should provide a valid driver's license, current vehicle registration, valid vehicle insurance certificate, and insert any additional requirements to comply with local security procedures to obtain a vehicle pass.

(c) During performance of the contract, the contractor shall be responsible for obtaining required identification for newly assigned personnel and for prompt return of credentials and vehicle passes for any employee who no longer requires access to the work site.

(d) When work under this contract requires unescorted entry to controlled or restricted areas, the contractor shall comply with AFI 31-101, Volume 1, The Air Force Installation Security Program, and AFI 31-501, Personnel Security Program Management, as applicable.

(e) Upon completion or termination of the contract or expiration of the identification passes, the prime contractor shall ensure that all base identification passes issued to employees and subcontractor employees are returned to the issuing office.

(f) Failure to comply with these requirements may result in withholding of final payment.

(End of clause)

FCA-001 PRICE ADJUSTMENT CLAUSE

a. The contractor's price shall include all dumping and disposal charges which are in effect at the time of proposal submission. The contractor will pay any additional charges that may be imposed by the county or municipalities after proposal submission for the initial contract year. All increased or decreased dumping and disposal charges imposed by the county or municipalities for subsequent contract option years are subject to price adjustment pursuant to the paragraphs below.

b. -If dumping and disposal fees increase or decrease during the performance of this contract, an adjustment to the contract price will be made if the contract option is exercised. The adjustment will go into effect on the effective date of the option or effective date of increase, whichever is later, and shall not be retroactive. The contractor shall provide the name of the dumping site used, the current published price list, and acceptable historical data reflecting monthly tonnage collected and disposed of against this contract.

c. The contract price as adjusted in accordance with this clause shall be set forth in a contract modification. No adjustment shall apply to services which are required to be performed prior to the effective date of the adjustment.

d. The final invoice submitted under this contract shall include a certification that the contractor has not experienced a decrease in rates of disposal fees set forth in the contract or that notice was given of all such decreases and the contract price was adjusted downward according.

**STATEMENT OF WORK FOR
SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT SERVICES
9 Dec 2003**

1. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES. The contractor shall perform solid waste collection at Fairchild AFB, WA. Service includes collection of compost and recycling material from military family housing. The contractor is encouraged and expected to use innovative approaches to efficiently and effectively accomplish SOW requirements in a timely manner, at a reasonable cost, and in a way that fosters pride and ownership in the work performed. The contractor shall provide technical expertise to assist Fairchild AFB in achieving its annual solid waste diversion goals.

1.1 Collection Requirements.

1.1.1. Routes/Schedule Submittals. The contractor shall develop collection routes and a collection schedule for submission and approval by the Contracting Officer (CO) prior to contract performance. The schedule shall also indicate if collection will be performed on federal holidays. To ensure efficiency the contractor shall produce a revised schedule whenever it is deemed appropriate. Route and schedule changes made after contract award shall be coordinated and forwarded to the CO for approval prior to implementation. Additionally, the contractor shall notify Quality Assurance Personnel (QAP) of any conditions that may interrupt the schedule of performance such as disposal sites backed up, delays due to security measures, exercises, vehicle breakdowns, blocked containers, etc. Collections as a result of these delays shall be performed the next workday.

1.1.2. Additional Collections. Upon notification by the QAP or the Facility Manager, the contractor shall provide additional collection and disposal of containers within one workday after notification. See Appendix A for workload data.

1.1.3. Points of Collection/Relocation. Collection locations for solid waste, housing recycle materials, and compost are shown in Appendix A. Changes in dumpster location must be approved by the QAP. The QAP may direct the contractor to relocate or reposition dumpsters when required. The contractor shall perform these relocations within one workday after notification. (See Appendix A for workload data).

1.1.4. Base Dumpsters. Collection of refuse shall be from contractor-provided dumpsters. Dumpsters shall be cathedral-type. A minimum of 20, 8-cubic yard dumpsters must have the capability to be filled from the back. All dumpsters shall be numbered and match the color scheme of the base (Spanish Moss, Sherwin-Williams SW-2070 or equal, Fairchild Linen (lettering), Federal Spec #595A-X3578), and shall be maintained to comply with base appearance standards. Dumpsters must have a locking mechanism that allows the dumpster to be emptied while locked. Dumpsters with small dockside doors must have locking mechanisms on all doors; however, the small dockside doors do not need to automatically open. The contractor shall ensure that all locking bars are in the locked position and all lids are closed on the dumpsters after emptying. The contractor shall ensure dumpsters are emptied in accordance with the approved collection schedule and shall pick up any litter or waste surrounding the dumpster during collection. The contractor shall also ensure dumpsters are emptied prior to exceeding their capacity. The contractor shall maintain dumpsters to ensure they are free of odors, dirt, debris, and pests.

1.1.5. Housing Containers. The contractor is required to provide weekly collection of refuse, compost, and recycle materials in the housing areas. One housing solid waste container is provided at each housing unit by the government and is suitable for mechanical pickup at curbside. The contractor is required to pick up any excess solid waste placed alongside the container. Excess waste in bags or containers will not exceed 32-gallons or 65-pounds. The contractor shall provide each occupant a hard plastic compost container, 90-gallon minimum, for grass, tree, and lawn trimmings (compost materials) and provide weekly collections from March through November. Christmas trees shall be collected at curbside and composted. The contractor shall provide housing recycle bins. Recycle bins must have labels identifying what materials are acceptable to put in bin and how they should be organized. Recyclables shall be collected, separated into contractor furnished containers (separate into individual containers by each type of material identified in paragraph 1.1.6), and delivered to the base recycle center for processing. Containers shall be left at the recycle center for 24 hours to be processed.

ATTACHMENT 1

1.1.6. Recyclable Materials. At a minimum, materials collected through the curbside recycling program in the housing areas shall include corrugated cardboard; (customers will only be required to flatten and fold cardboard to a maximum size of 4 by 6 feet); newspaper; aluminum cans; steel cans; magazines; clear, brown, and green glass beverage containers and jars; #1 PETE (natural and colored), #2 HDPE (natural and colored), #4 LDPE (light colored plastic shopping and garment bags), batteries; white/computer paper; mixed paper; and mixed waste paper (cereal boxes, pop container boxes, junk mail, etc.).

1.1.7. Bulk Item Pickup. The contractor shall provide quarterly, curbside bulk item pickup from housing and dormitories. Items for pickup will not exceed 10 feet in length or 300 lbs. and shall be non-hazardous. The date of pickup will be coordinated between the QAP and contractor. The contractor shall be encouraged to divert recyclable bulk items to the base recycle center.

1.1.8. Education. The contractor shall provide education to all residential occupants on the requirements associated with the contractor's collection program and shall advise housing residents of issues or problems encountered with their refuse, recycling, and compost on collection days. Issues or problems encountered shall be shared with the QAP and recycle services contractor.

1.1.9 Weighing. All solid waste and compost shall be weighed on state certified vehicle scales at the applicable dumpsite. Weigh station operators shall record weights on weigh tickets. Only waste and compost collected at Fairchild AFB shall be reflected.

1.1.10 Disposal. The contractor shall transport and dispose all burnable refuse at the Spokane Waste to Energy facility located approximately 6 miles from the base. All other waste, (i.e. construction debris), shall be disposed of at a state licensed, lined facility. Compost materials, including Christmas trees, shall be disposed of at a licensed off-base compost facility. All disposal costs will be charged as a pass through cost to the government.

1.2. REPORTS AND RECORDS. The contractor shall provide a monthly report detailing total tonnage for burnable solid waste, compost material, and refuse disposed in a landfill. Weigh tickets shall accompany the report and shall be submitted by the 2nd working day of the month. Weigh tickets shall be clearly readable. The monthly report shall also provide the number of households that participated in the curbside recycle program each week during the month.

3.3. Force Protection Requirements. In addition to the requirements of clause 5352.242-9000 Contractor Access to Air Force Installations (JUN 2002), during performance of this contract the contractor is responsible for:

- (1) Complying with all applicable security conditions. At the post award conference, the contractor will be provided guidance and appropriate instructions for force protection conditions.
- (2) Ensuring all contract employees receive force protection anti-terrorism training prior to performing under the contract. The government will provide relevant training information for contractor use.

3.4. Performance of Services During Crisis Declared By The President, Secretary of Defense, or Combatant Commander. IAW DoDI 3020.37 (continuation of Essential DoD Contractor Services During a Crisis), and aforementioned Air Force implementation, unless other wise directed by an authorized Government representative, it is determined that Refuse collection requirements under this Statement of Work are essential to be performed during a crisis. The Contracting Officer will notify the contractor of any changes to the hours of operation or procedures. The contractor shall only be permitted to bring empty trucks on to base.

Separate percentage goals for using small business concerns, veteran-owned small business, service-disabled veteran-owned small business, HUBZone small business, small disadvantaged business and women-owned small business concerns as subcontractors are detailed in **Exhibit A** of this document (attached).
2. (i) \$539,834 is planned to be subcontracted over the 5 year period of the base and option years.; (ii) \$539,834 will be spent with Western Systems a woman owned small business and Olgoonik Logistics a HUBZone, disadvantaged small business.; (iii) \$0 to be spent with a veteran-owned small business.; (iv) \$0 to be spent with a service-disabled veteran-owned small business.; (v) \$429,787 to be spent with Olgoonik Logistics a HUBZone small business.; (vi) \$429,787 to be spent with Olgoonik Logistics a small disadvantaged business.; (vii) \$110,047 will be spent with Western Systems a women-owned small business.

Please note that CLIN 2, 4, 5, 8 and 9 of Solicitation F45613-03-Q-A068 deal with waste disposal, which the location to be used and the fees to be paid are established by local government and out of the control of Waste Management and Fairchild Air Force Base. Therefore, our Small Business Subcontracting Plan does not consider these CLIN.

3. (i) Recycling collection services and bulk container and drop box purchases provided by small business concerns are the principal types of supplies and services to be subcontracted in the Plan.; (ii) N/A to veteran-owned small business.; (iii) N/A to service-disabled veteran-owned small business.; (iv) Recycling collection services in the Military Family Housing areas provided by Olgoonik Logistics a HUBZone small business.; (v) Recycling collection services in the Military Family Housing areas provided by Olgoonik Logistics small disadvantaged business.; (vi) Bulk containers and drop boxes purchased from Western Systems a women-owned small business.




4. Waste Management has existing relationships with both of our initial subcontractors that were established during prior contracts with Fairchild Air Force Base. Currently, Olgoonik Logistics, LLC, a HUBZone and small disadvantaged business are the subcontractors for Waste Management. Under the new contract, Olgoonik Logistics will continue as our subcontractor providing residential recycling collection services. Additionally, all bulk container purchases will be made from Western Systems, a woman-owned small business concern where we have an existing relationship.
5. Waste Management did not need to do extensive search to find qualified business concerns for subcontracting opportunities due to existing relationships as described in #4 above.
6. Indirect costs were not used when establishing subcontracting goals.
7. Dan Baasch, District Manager, will administer the Sub-contracting Plan for Waste Management. His duties will include but are not limited to:
 - 1) Responsibility for calling qualified subcontractors when additional subcontracting opportunities arise;
 - 2) Negotiating subcontracts;
 - 3) Working with the FAFB Contracting Officer or their designee to monitor Plan compliance and modify the Plan if required;
 - 4) Ensure documentation of subcontracting efforts and timely completion of reporting requirements.
8. Waste Management is not pursuing other sources for subcontracting at this time due to satisfactory small business subcontracting relationships that are currently in place. If the need and/or opportunity arise, Waste Management will be willing to secure other qualified subcontractors.
9. Waste Management will include the clause of this contract entitled "Utilization of Small Business Concerns" in all subcontracts that offer further subcontracting opportunities, and that Waste Management will require all subcontractors (except small business concerns) that receive subcontracts in excess of \$500,000, to adopt a plan similar to the plan that complies with the requirements of clause 52.219-9.
10. Waste Management will (i) cooperate in any studies or surveys as may be required; (ii) submit periodic reports so that the Government can determine the extent of compliance of the subcontracting plan; (iii) submit Standard Form (SF) 294, Subcontracting Report for Individual Contracts, and/or Summary Subcontract Report, in accordance with paragraph (j) of the clause. Reporting shall be in accordance with the instructions on



the forms or as provided in agency regulations; and (iv) ensure that our subcontractors agree to submit SF 294 and 295.

11. Waste Management will maintain and have for the Government's review, certification letters from any subcontractors utilized that they qualify as a small, small veteran owned, small service-disabled veteran-owned, HUBZone, small disadvantaged or small women-owned business concerns. Additionally, if the need arises due to additional subcontract opportunities, records regarding efforts to locate small business concerns including but not limited to source lists, guides and other data.
