RE: Washington State Pipeline Safety Program- Response to 2022 Evaluation Letter

Dear Mr. Barrett:

Thank you for your letter dated June 24, 2022. I appreciate the opportunity to update the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) about the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission's (UTC) pipeline safety program.

Below is our response to the one issue (item number 1) identified in your letter:

1. Our observation of WUTC staff's June 6-8, 2022, inspection of the BP-Olympics' Intrastate Crude Oil and Butane Pipeline facilities revealed that the inspector failed to review records related to right-of-way (ROW) patrolling performed including ROW conditions, markers, crossings, and possible mitigation efforts performed. Only a cursory review of Public Awareness and Damage Prevention elements was conducted and did not encompass calendar years 2019, 2020, and 2021 as intended. Questions, where the record review was not adequate, were marked with a satisfactory result on the inspection form and were communicated as such to the operator during the exit interview. Five points were deducted for not conducting an adequate records review to properly determine operator compliance.

The commission acknowledges PHMSA's finding that staff did not conduct an adequate records review during the specified inspection of BP-Olympic's intrastate facilities. As a result of this shortcoming, our pipeline safety division leadership implemented a corrective action plan that

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included a reinspection of items omitted during the original inspection. Records and field checks during this reinspection were conducted under direct supervision of our Chief Engineer, Scott Rukke.

The program has implemented additional corrective measures including a supervisory review and reinforcement of internal procedures and minimum standards for pre-inspection planning with the inspector in question, as well as additional in-person mentorship opportunities during select inspections for the rest of the CY 2022 work plan. We anticipate that these corrective actions will minimize the likelihood of this oversight reoccurring.

Thank you and David Lykken for your professionalism and courtesy throughout the audit. Mr. Lykken's experience and insights have been particularly valuable as our assigned auditor.
